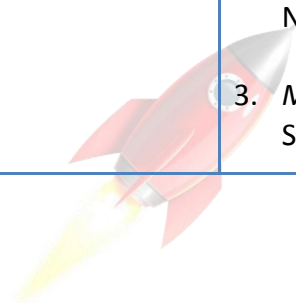
### The Launch of the Kent, Surrey & Sussex Learning Disability Community of Practice

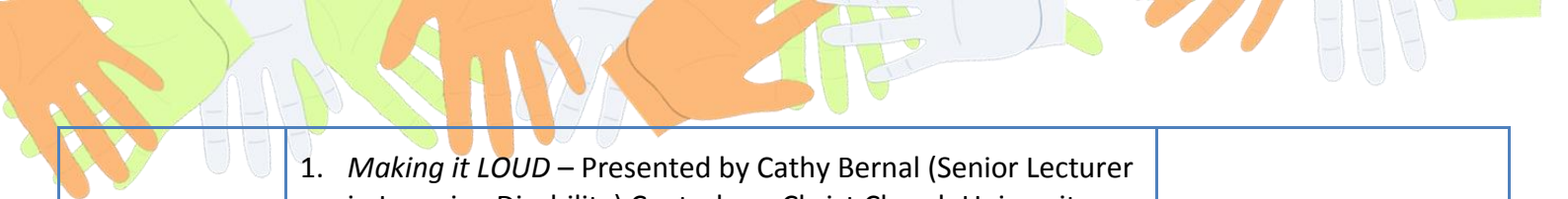
15<sup>th</sup> of June 2016 at the Charis Centre, Crawley

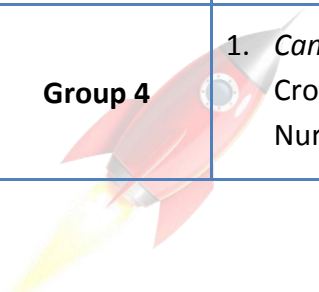
